(from the reef point gardens bulletin, august 1950) the garden month by month march snowdrops, early iris, winter aconite. april chrysanthemums in cutting garden, oaks browning to russet, crabapple fruits, burning bush (euonymus alatus) winterberry scarlets. Reef point estate was located in bar harbor, maine, united states, on mount desert island. reef point was the coastal "cottage" of mary cadwalder rawle and frederic rhineland jones, the parents of landscape architect, beatrix farrand (1872-1959).
